


Attendance every day counts.

INTERNET SAFETY – IT'S THE RESPONSIBILITY OF EVERYONE!

With summer holidays almost upon us, for our final online safety update of the year, I thought it would be useful to think about how we can support our children with the games and apps they use.

The children have just over 6 weeks off and many will no doubt fill part of this time online. It is an ideal opportunity to sit down with them over the summer, without the pressures of the school week, and play with them on their games and apps to get to know more about the huge amount of fun they are having, but also discover the potential risks.

Conversations with our children about tech can be difficult, especially if we ourselves aren't techsavvy or don't really have an interest in tech at all. Perhaps this summer holiday is the time to really get to know what games and apps your children are playing. Talking calmly and showing an interest in what children are doing is the most powerful way to reduce risks. It helps build trust with our children so they know we're not out to stop them having fun, but that they can come to us with any problem they experience online without the fear of being told off.

But, where should we start?
