


#### Attendance every day counts.

# # Harvest Festival Service & Collection # Thursday 9th October – 9:15am at St Nicholas Church

We warmly invite all families to join us for our **whole-school Harvest Festival Service** at St Nicholas Church. This is a special opportunity to come together in celebration and reflection, and we hope as many of you as possible will be able to attend.



As part of our Harvest tradition, we are continuing our support for the **elderly and those in need within our parish**. We kindly ask families to contribute to our **Harvest Collection** by donating **non-perishable food items**, which will be distributed to local causes including day centres for the elderly.

**Donations can be brought to school from Monday.** Please ensure items have at least **4–6 months left** on their use-by date.

#### Most appreciated items include:

- Pasta, rice, flour, spaghetti
- Tinned fruit, vegetables, meat, and fish (e.g. ham, tuna, sardines)
- Spreads: jam, sandwich spreads, meat/fish pastes
- · Biscuits (sweet or savoury), simple cakes
- Cooking sauces, condiments (e.g., ketchup, mayonnaise)
- Tea, coffee, sugar, milk powder, cooking oil
- Instant potato, packet/tinned soups
- Toiletries: soap, toothpaste, disinfectant, washing powder



#### Apply for free school meals

In Kent, 21% of children receive free school meals. If you are eligible your school will get £1550 per child & your child will get:

- a choice of delicious, healthy hot meals every school day at no cost - this is worth £470 a year per child and recognised to improve behaviour and learning
- meals to cater for cultural, dietary, and religious requirements
- the chance to develop social skills by sitting with friends for a school meal.

#### **Celebrating the European Day of Languages:**




Every year on **September 26th**, Europe comes together to celebrate one of its most vibrant and unifying treasures: **language**.

### Six Ways to Wellbeing project



This year at St Nicholas, we are again linking our Six Ways to Wellbeing project with our exciting whole-school theme of the planet's biomes.


#### What is a biome?

A biome is a large natural area of the world, such as the rainforest, desert, ocean, tundra, grassland, or savannah. Each biome has its own special climate, plants, and animals. Learning about them helps children understand how amazing – and fragile – our planet is.

#### How does this link to wellbeing?

Each term, we will focus on one of the Six Ways to Wellbeing (Connect, Be Active, Take Notice, Keep Learning, Give, Care for the Planet). At the same time, each year group will explore a different biome as part of their learning. Together, these two themes will help children build healthy habits for life while also learning about the world we share.





For example, while learning about the rainforest, children might Connect through teamwork activities, Take Notice of the rich variety of plant and animal life, or Care for the Planet by learning why rainforests are important for Earth's health.

By combining wellbeing with our biome theme, we hope children will see how looking after themselves and looking after the planet go hand-in-hand. We look forward to sharing each term's focus with you through the newsletter so families can join in too.

#### Year 1

Spent their afternoon focusing on Place: What do we notice? They linked this with their learning of the changing seasons and finding signs of Autumn! The children made their own journey sticks in the outside area.

The children worked together, helped each other and encouraged others. The children also took these photos themselves We're very impressed!







**Year 3 -** thought about plastic pollution (as it linked to its class text - Flotsam) and how it is affecting the planet, in particular oceans and rainforests where a lot of microplastics are ending up. The children created posters and a big mural as seen in the pictures.

## **★** Bringing Music to Life on the Marsh – A Local Success Story

Eleven years ago, a passionate group of parents and musicians from Folkestone, Hythe, and the Romney Marsh came together to address the lack of music education in local schools. Their solution? The creation of a charity-run music academy offering free brass instrument tuition to children aged 8–18. Starting with just a few students, the academy has grown to over 50 young musicians, divided into three bands: beginners, training, and senior concert band. As students improve, they progress through the levels—giving them clear goals and a sense of achievement.

Thanks to generous support from local Rotary Clubs and fundraising efforts, instruments and music are provided, and children pay just £3 per week to participate. The academy welcomes children from all backgrounds and is currently seeking new members from the Romney Marsh area.
