


## Attendance every day counts.

# **Apply for free school meals**

In Kent, 21% of children receive free school meals. If you are eligible & your school will get £1550 per child & your child will get:

- a choice of delicious, healthy hot meals every school day at no cost this is worth £470 a year per child and recognised to improve behaviour and learning
- meals to cater for cultural, dietary, and religious requirements
- the chance to develop social skills by sitting with friends for a school meal.

# ■ IMPORTANT COMMUNITY WARNING FOR PARENTS ■

Dear Parents, we are becoming increasingly aware of issues arising from the WhatsApp group **"Every Kid U Know"** and others like it. Many children under the age of 13 are active in these chats, despite WhatsApp's age restriction. This is a **growing concern in our community**. These groups can expose children to:

- Inappropriate content
- Bullying or peer pressure
- Unsafe or unknown contacts
- Conversations that parents are unaware of

### What you can do:

- Check which WhatsApp groups your child is part of
- Know who they are messaging and what's being shared
- Talk to them about respectful and safe online behaviour
- Monitor their usage regularly WhatsApp is not suitable for under-13s
- Report any harmful or concerning activity to the appropriate adults or authorities

This is not just about screen time — it's about **safeguarding our children**. Let's work together to ensure they are protected, supported, and guided in their digital lives.

## Safeguarding Information: Children's "Spy" Books



We want to make you aware of a report of a recent issue affecting some popular children's books by Andrew Cope, including the Spy Dogs, Spy Cats, and Spy Pups series. Some editions of these books include a printed web address at the back. This link used to go to the author's website, but the domain is no longer under his control. It has since been

taken over by another party and now leads to inappropriate adult content.

The publisher, Puffin, has paused sales and distribution of the books.

They have stressed that the website has no connection to the author or publisher.





### What this means for you as a parent:

- If your child has any Spy Dog, Spy Cat or Spy Pups books at home, please check the back for website links and make sure they do not try to visit the sites.
- It is safe for children to continue reading the stories themselves the concern is only with the outdated link.
- We recommend talking with your child about the importance of not following web addresses in books without checking with an adult first.

### Bringing Music to Life on the Marsh – A Local Success Story

Eleven years ago, a passionate group of parents and musicians from Folkestone, Hythe, and the Romney Marsh came together to address the lack of music education in local schools. Their solution? The creation of a **charity-run music academy** offering free brass instrument tuition to children aged 8–18. Starting with just a few students, the academy has grown to over **50 young musicians**, divided into three bands: beginners, training, and senior concert band. As students improve, they progress through the levels—giving them clear goals and a sense of achievement.

Thanks to generous support from local Rotary Clubs and fundraising efforts, instruments and music are provided, and children pay just £3 per week to participate. The academy welcomes children from all backgrounds and is currently seeking new members from the Romney Marsh area.
