It's been another exciting week of learning and enrichment here at school, with so many wonderful opportunities for our children to engage, explore, and create.

We were delighted to welcome visitors from the **New Romney Art Society**, who spent time working with our Year 2 pupils. The children had a fantastic experience exploring new artistic techniques and expressing their creativity through a range of media. It's always inspiring to see their confidence grow when guided by practising artists, and we are very grateful for the Society's continued support of our Arts curriculum.

Meanwhile, our friends from Light Up New Romney have also been in school, working with pupils in Year 4 as they begin preparations for their next Street Parade project. The children are buzzing with excitement about what's to come — but I've been told it's top secret until the big event, so parents will have to wait and see what surprises are in store!

Our learning has also extended beyond the classroom this week, with Year 1 visiting the Old School House to deepen their understanding of local history, and Year 3 enjoying a trip to F51, where they explored the climbing walls and working in teams in a state-of-the-art environment. Year 5 visited **St Nicholas church** on Tuesday to identify key features within the building. All these visits provided valuable hands-on learning experiences for the children and lots of enthusiasm to bring back to the classroom.

We also marked Bonfire Night with a special Firework Lunch in the hall. There was a lovely atmosphere, with children enjoying themed food, decorations, and plenty of fun and laughter to celebrate the occasion.

In addition, we hosted our second NELFT Key Event for Parents, which focused on Supporting My Autistic Child. These sessions are an excellent opportunity for families to hear directly from medical and educational professionals about how best to support their children's needs.

Our next NELFT workshop will be on Thursday, 13 November, from 9:00-**11:00am**, on the topic of *Understanding ADHD*. I am often asked by parents for advice about conditions such as Autism and ADHD, and I cannot recommend these events highly enough. If you have any concerns or would like to learn more, please do take the time to attend. The information and guidance shared at these sessions can make a real difference for families. Thank you, as always, for your continued support and engagement in school life.




Attendance every day counts.

Online Safety Update: - Roblox Update



As the most popular game on the planet with children, Roblox gets a lot of coverage and understandably so. It's an amazing platform to explore but it isn't without its faults, some of which are very significant.

In April 2025 Revealing Reality carried out an investigation into Roblox due to serious concerns of what children were experiencing

within the game (link <u>HERE</u>). In September they carried out a follow-up investigation to see what, if anything had changed.

In short, quite a lot has changed, such as:

- Adjustments to content maturity ratings.
- ID verification for certain games and experiences.
- Stricter moderation
- Enhanced parental controls.

These are good but, according to Revealing Reality, they don't go far enough. There are still workarounds and very significant concerns. It's worth having a read of the full report which you can find **HERE**.

For Parents - Roblox Age Estimation

As the most popular game in the world Roblox has come under a lot of criticism recently, particularly in regards to predatory activity on the platform. Whilst Roblox has always had fairly good parental controls in place, ages of users have always been a concern, particularly adults pretending to be younger children.

Recently Roblox have announced that they are expanding facial age estimation and ID age verification to all users who access the communication features within Roblox, as well as new systems designed to limit communication between adults and children unless they know each other in the real world.

The word 'limit' has me a little concerned as there is no information on what that actually means, but regardless it's definitely a step in the right direction which I think may parents will welcome. Apparently there have been over 100 safety initiatives since January 2025 on Roblox, I wasn't aware of that, but there is lots of information for parents **HERE**.

Next week (10 - 14 November) is **Anti-Bullying Week 2025**. This year's theme, **Power for Good**, is about empowering young people to safely speak up and raise awareness when they see bullying, both in-person and online. To mark the start of Anti-Bullying Week 2025. We would like

to encourage all children on Monday 10th November to wear 'odd socks' to celebrate what makes us all unique. Children will wear their school uniform as normal on this day.

What is bullying and what can I do? Bullying is behaviour by an individual or group, repeated over time, that intentionally hurts another individual or group either physically or emotionally.



It can happen anywhere: in the classroom, corridors and playground, or outside of school – both online and offline. Some pupils can face prejudice-based or discriminatory bullying, based on perceived differences.







Every year bullying impacts the lives of countless young people and helps it to grow. We stand with trying to empower children and young people to use their Power for Good to speak out, support others, and build a world where kindness wins.
