

Policy reminders. We are a nut free school.



At St Nicholas we aim to be a Nut-Free school. The school aims to protect children who have allergies to nuts yet also help them, as they grow up, to take responsibility as to what foods they can eat and to be aware of where they may be put at risk. We do not allow nuts or nut products in school lunch boxes.

Our "Nut-Free Policy" means that the following should **not** be brought into school:

- Packs of nuts
- Peanut butter or Nutella sandwiches
- Fruit and cereal bars that contain nuts
- Any home cooked meals for packed lunches that are made from nuts
- Chocolate bars or sweets that contain nuts
- Cakes made with nuts
- Sesame seed rolls



ONLINE SAFETY UPDATE - For Parents - Playstation Family App



The Playstation Family App came out in September 2025 and it is a great way to help parents set up and manage their children's Gaming experience. Features include:

- Manage playtime.
- Activity report.
- Visibility into what children are playing.
- Approving playtime requests.

On this web page you will find detailed instructions to guide you through setting up a child account, get notified what game your child is playing in real time, approve or decline a request for extra playtime, apply content filters, privacy settings and more.

For Parents - Family Gaming Database

When it comes to app and games reviews one of the resources I consistently share during parents talks is [Common Sense Media](#) who have thousands of unbiased and up-to-date reviews which can be really helpful for parents over and above age ratings. But when it comes to games specifically there's an equally great site which is often overlooked called [The Family Gaming Database](#). This is a fantastic resource with a plethora of information for families and currently 3,485 video games and 197 board games already reviewed.



Operation Encompass is a police and education early information sharing partnership enabling schools to offer immediate support for children experiencing the impact of domestic abuse. Information is shared by the police with a school's trained Key Adult (DSL) when officers have attended a domestic abuse incident. Children experiencing domestic abuse are negatively impacted by this exposure; with domestic abuse identified as an Adverse Childhood Experience (ACE).

Operation Encompass aims to mitigate this harm by enabling immediate support and thus making the child's day better.
